

## IRENA-CAPP Regional Model Analysis & Planning Programme Final presentation session • 29 September 2021

**Virtual meeting (via Zoom) • Language: English – French – Portuguese**

### Concept Note & Agenda

Since February 2021, the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) and the Central African Power Pool (CAPP) have been implementing a six-month long Regional Model Analysis and Planning Programme for seven CAPP member states.<sup>1</sup> Responding to member state requests to strengthen capacity for long-term energy planning processes and tools, the programme has delivered practical training to expert staff of national power sector planning institutions on the MESSAGE modelling software, and how to develop national generation capacity expansion scenarios with the IRENA System Planning Test (SPLAT) model framework. Roughly 50 participants representing both Ministries and Utilities have participated in the training, and have successfully used their knowledge to develop national power sector scenarios and summary reports of their work.

In this final session for the programme, IRENA, the CAPP Secretariat, and country participants would like to present the work that has been done to high-level representatives from regional and international organisations involved in energy planning in the region. A draft agenda for the session is included below, and we would like to kindly invite representatives to join as discussants in morning and/or afternoon presentation sessions, to raise awareness of the capacity that has been built over the past six months.
