

Challenges in current support to energy planning

Externally-driven support

• Lack of buy-in from local stakeholders, leaders and policy-makers

Planning capacity is not sustained or institutionalised

· Low uptake and continuity of evidence-based planning

Fragmented support by donors

• Little strategic alignment, duplication of work and emphasis on supply-side

Lack of standardised and transparent data

• Evidence not robust and flexible enough to support effective modelling

Planning tools have limits and datasets are hard to find

Low accessibility of the right data and tools

Five principles for development partner engagement in strategic energy planning

1. National ownership

2. Coherence of strategic decisions

3. Capacity building

4. Robustness of planning

5. Data transparency and accessibility
